ABOUT THE DIRECTORY

The Bay Area Afterschool Training & Support Directory was compiled and distributed by the Bay Area Partnership in collaboration with the Partnership for After School Education. Thanks to the generous support of the David and Lucile Packard and the Charles Stewart Mott Foundations, we are pleased to publish the Bay Area's first directory of afterschool support providers.

The Bay Area Partnership (BAP) is a regional, nine-county initiative that consists of federal, state, local, nonprofit and business partners working together to assure progress, particularly in the 52 lowest income neighborhoods in the Bay Area. BAP provides catalytic leadership to assist communities in moving ahead on the indicators important to them, and has been working over the past three years to help Bay Area communities develop and sustain quality afterschool programs for youth. BAP offers many resources for communities and schools interested in promoting the afterschool field, including program development assistance, policy development and advocacy coordination, and the publication of the Bay Area Regional Afterschool and Nutrition Network (BARANN), an e-newsletter resource for afterschool and nutrition program providers and supporters. USER'S GUIDE

WHAT IS A “SUPPORT PROVIDER” FOR AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS ?

A support provider is an individual or organization who provides various types of assistance and resources for afterschool programs. This can include training, technical assistance, staff development, curriculum, or any form of consulting that could enrich a local afterschool program.

WHO CAN USE THIS DIRECTORY?

This Directory was created for afterschool program directors and coordinators, as well as schools and school district personnel interested in starting an afterschool program. Although the directory was tailored for school-based programs, most of the support providers work with private and community based programs as well.

WHO ARE THE PROVIDERS CONTAINED IN THIS DIRECTORY?

Each provider listed in this Directory is a self-identified support provider for afterschool programs in the Bay Area. These support providers may have very specific areas of expertise, such as “assisting schools with increasing parent involvement,” or very broad abilities in helping programs with an array of issues from start-up to sustainability.

At the beginning of the Directory is a complete listing of all the identified afterschool training and support providers here in the Bay Area. This listing includes a complete description of each providers’ offering and areas of expertise. After this complete listing, the support that these providers offer are divided into four topic areas:

- ❖ Program Start-up
- ❖ Staff Training
- ❖ Programming & Curriculum
- ❖ Sustainability

If you need assistance determining in which topic area your program’s needs fit, turn to page #, and fill out the Afterschool Program Needs Assessment Survey.

Program Start-up

Support providers who assist with afterschool “program start-up” are able to help program coordinators and schools with the necessary steps to launch an afterschool program. These services include grant writing and strategic planning, protocol and policy development, staff hiring, collaborative building, and the design of day-to-day program operations, schedules, and management. These are the providers to call if you are starting a program, have just launched a new program, are thinking about launching an afterschool program, or if you just want to overhaul the management of your existing program.

Staff Training

If a support provider specializes in “staff training,” they are a resource for new and existing afterschool programs that have staff training or development needs. These providers may hold workshops or provide on-site assistance in many different areas of training such as cultural awareness, discipline, curriculum development, or case management. Most of the providers will have their areas of training expertise listed in this directory, but check with any provider regarding their breadth of possible topics.

Programmatic/Curriculum Development

Programmatic & Curriculum Development support providers are able to assist afterschool program staff with the development and shaping of afterschool program curriculum and activities. A provider’s expertise can range from math and reading curriculum to nutrition education, karate, fine arts, and more. Each provider’s specific areas of expertise are detailed in the alphabetical listing in the front of this guide.

Program Sustainability

Support providers with expertise in “program sustainability” are able to help existing afterschool programs deal with issues surrounding sustainability, fundraising, or refining their program’s management. In many cases, these providers are the same as those who help with program start-up, and can assist afterschool programs in expanding, overhauling, and sustaining their programs.

Support providers listed in this directory offer their services either for a fee or for free. This distinction is noted in their entry. Also noted are the providers’ preferences for site-based, district-based or workshop-based assistance.

If these topics do not seem to translate into your programs’ needs, there is a program survey on page # that will help you to determine in which topic area your program’s needs fit. The complete alphabetical order listing of support providers is located in the front of the directory. This listing includes all of the sub-categories found in the program survey, in addition to the four main topic areas of Program Start-up, Staff Training, Programming & Curriculum, and Sustainability.

HOW DO I USE THIS DIRECTORY TO FIND A SUPPORT PROVIDER?

As you can see from the table of contents, each afterschool support provider in this directory has been divided into two categories:

- ❖ Topic area of expertise
- ❖ Geographic scope

As described in the previous section, afterschool support providers are divided into their specific area of expertise: Program Start-up, Staff Training, Programmatic/Curriculum Development, and Program Sustainability. The beginning of each section can be found in the Table of Contents.

At the front of the directory is the complete alphabetical listing of each afterschool support provider, their topic areas, sub-categories of expertise (these sub-categories, which match the program survey, are not found in the topic and geographic sections), and their preferred geographic scope. After finding a support provider that fits your program’s needs, please check out this alpha listing for more details regarding the provider’s offerings.

The geographic scope of the support provider indicates in which counties the provider prefers to work. All of the providers in this directory have been divided into these categories:

- ❖ Bay-Area Wide
- ❖ North Bay
- ❖ East Bay
- ❖ San Francisco, Peninsula Region
- ❖ South Bay

Bay-Area Wide providers will work with programs in the greater Bay Area including Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Solano, and Sonoma counties.

North Bay providers prefer to work with afterschool programs in Sonoma, Napa, Marin and Solano counties.

East Bay providers prefer to work with programs in Contra Costa and Alameda counties.

San Francisco/Peninsula providers prefer to work in San Francisco and San Mateo counties, and **South Bay** providers prefer to work in Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, and Monterey counties. Each geographic area is noted in the table of contents.
